1. Does the draft practice profile clearly explain its purpose, and how it should be used in relation to complex compounding?

The delineation between the practice profile and the compounding guideline is clear.

2. Is there any content that needs to be changed, added or deleted in the draft practice profile in relation to complex compounding?

The sterile compounding guidelines 5.3 and 5.4 appear to only consider laminar flow cabinets as the appropriate equipment with which to admix sterile medicines. Given the specificity of the practice profile inclusion of pharmaceutical isolators in the profile would better reflect current practice.

Point 5.4 should include ability to review OHS guidelines for cytotoxic preparation and handling. In addition required documentation and licensing should be mentioned.

4. Do you have any other comments on the draft practice profile?

Much sterile training is completed in house with external validation of the outcome. Formal training in the use of laminar flow cabinets, pharmaceutical isolators and aseptic technique is not readily available.

The board may need to consider an implementation timeframe for formal training to be made available to all practitioners who need it.

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
