# 1 Reference texts for pharmacists

The following is the list of reference texts\* for pharmacists referred to in Guideline 1 of the Board's *Guidelines on practice-specific issues.* 

\*Minor amendments were made to the titles of references on 15 March 2023 and 18 August 2023 to reflect currently available versions of reference texts. Refer to Appendix A for a table of changes.

**Current editions** of the following references in the form of a published document (hard copy) or via electronic means, such as computer, must be readily accessible and should be accessed by pharmacists during the clinical assessment, reviewing, dispensing and counselling processes:

- a) the Australian Pharmaceutical Formulary and Handbook (APF)
- b) the Australian Medicines Handbook (AMH)
- c) Therapeutic Guidelines [digital]
- d) a source of current Australian product information and consumer medicine information
  - AusDI, or
  - A MIMS product\* that provides a complete list of current Australian product information and consumer medicine information.

\*Note: MIMS Integrated is integrated into dispensing software and to be an acceptable reference to meet this section of the guideline, the software must include product information and consumer medicine information updates

# e) a drug interactions reference (updated at least quarterly)

- AusDI
- Drug Interaction Facts Facts and Comparisons
- A MIMS product\* that provides access to the full drug interactions database provided by MIMS
- Micromedex
- Stockley's Drug Interactions Online, or
- Lexicomp Interactions.

\*Note: MIMS Integrated is integrated into dispensing software to be an acceptable reference to meet this section of the guideline, the software must include routine drug interaction updates.

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- f) the AMH Children's Dosing Companion
- g) the Australian Don't Rush to Crush Handbook
- h) an evidence-based reference work on complementary and alternative medicines
  - Herbs and Natural Supplements: An evidence-based guide. Braun and Cohen
  - Herbal Medicines. Barnes, Anderson and Phillipson
  - Herbal Medicines and Dietary Supplements package (each resource can be independently accessed through MedicinesComplete)
  - MedlinePlus: Drugs, Herbs and Supplements (available free online)
  - Natural & Alternative Treatments: EBSCO, or
  - Natural Medicines (formerly *Natural Standard* and *Natural Medicines Comprehensive Database*).

### i) copies of the legislation controlling the practice of pharmacy:

- the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as in force in each state and territory (the National Law)
- Drugs, medicines and poisons legislation
- Standards, codes and guidelines relevant to pharmacy practice for each jurisdiction (including information published by relevant government departments and jurisdictional pharmacy premises registering authorities)
- Standard for the Uniform Scheduling of Medicines and Poisons (SUSMP).
- j) the Australian Immunisation Handbook
- k) the professional practice standards and guidelines published by the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) and The Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia (SHPA)
- I) the Pharmacy Board of Australia guidelines

#### m) the MSD Manual (Professional Version)

(Merck Sharp and Dohme).

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These guidelines will be reviewed at least every five years.
